

## WEDNESDAY, SEPTEMBER 25: ARTISTIC HUES & VINEYARD VIEWS



Museum of Art is arguably the first museum of contemporary art in the United States, collecting the “Old Masters of tomorrow” since the inception of the Carnegie International in 1896. Today, the museum is one of the most dynamic major art institutions in America and a cultural leader in the Pittsburgh region. Its collection of more than 34,000 objects features a broad spectrum of visual arts. Through its programming, exhibitions, and publications, the museum frequently explores the role of art and artists in confronting key social issues of our time, combining and juxtaposing local and global perspectives.



In addition to museum, you will immerse yourself in the allure of **Narcisi Winery**, a family-owned Italian wine haven. Guided by seasoned experts, wander through the vineyards, then delve into the winemaking process, witnessing the artistry of crushing, pressing, fermenting, filtering, and bottling. Experience a private tasting, exploring wine nuances, followed by a delightful alfresco lunch buffet amidst the winery’s landscape.

## THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 26: FALLING WATER W/ THE STONE HOUSE



Fallingwater is a house in the mountains of Southwestern Pennsylvania designed in 1935 by renowned American architect Frank Lloyd Wright (1867-1959) for the Kaufmann family, owners of Pittsburgh's largest department store. One of Wright's most widely acclaimed works, Fallingwater exemplifies his philosophy of organic architecture: the harmonious union of art and nature. It truly celebrates the power of design in harmony with nature!

In this guided tour you will experience Frank Lloyd Wright's most recognized example of the union of architecture and nature. As you walk the beautiful, forested grounds and explore the house from both interior spaces and outdoor cantilevered terraces, you will closely examine Fallingwater's intimate relationship with the mountainous landscape that inspired its design. Inside the living room, one of modern architecture's most iconic spaces, you will experience Wright's pioneering idea of "breaking the box" and see an exceptional collection of fine and decorative art as well as custom-made furniture designed by Wright specifically for Fallingwater. You will go behind-the-scenes to see the kitchen and servants' sitting room, and, as if you were guests of the Kaufmann family, experience the living and sleeping accommodations in the Guest House.

## THURSDAY, SEPTEMBER 26: FALLING WATER W/ THE STONE HOUSE CONTINUED:



The Stone House Restaurant and Country Inn, continues a time-honored tradition of dining and rest for the weary traveler. One of the original wayside inns along the National Road, the Stone House first opened its doors in 1822 to waggoners and travelers seeking renewed health in the waters of nearby Fayette Springs. Ever since those early days, it has been regarded by travelers and locals alike as a charming getaway for dining.

Time in Route: 57.9 miles/1 hour 30 minutes from Sheraton Station Square Hotel to The Stone House Restaurant & County Inn. 13.7 miles/30 minutes from The Stone House Restaurant & County Inn to Falling Water. 68.9 miles/1 hour 30 minutes from Falling Water to the Sheraton Station Square Hotel.

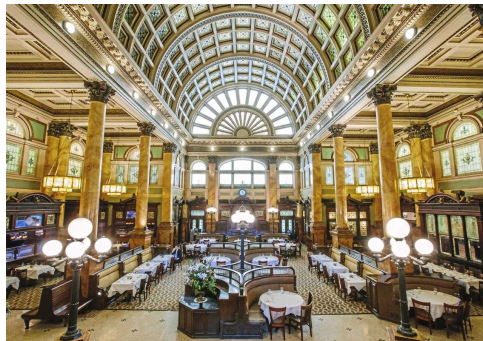

## FRIDAY, SEPTEMBER 27: RENOWNED POP ART & HISTORIC ELEGANCE



Immerse yourself in the vibrant art scene of Pittsburgh with a unique and creative experience at the Andy Warhol Museum.

Your journey begins by stepping into the colorful world of the legendary pop artist, Andy Warhol. This museum is one of the most comprehensive single-artist museums in the world and the largest in North America. Here you will explore an extensive collection of art and archives that give you a glimpse into Andy Warhol's life and legacy. After the tour, you will dive into his revolutionary silkscreen printing technique. Get ready to experiment with patterns, colors, and imagery to create your own personalized silkscreen print. Through this immersive experience, you will discover your inner artist, unleash your creativity, and leave with a piece of art that reflects your journey.



Following the museum experience, your artistic appetite will be satisfied with a lunch at the majestic railroad station, The Grand Concourse, built in 1902. The 80,000 square foot historical landmark, which incorporated Victorian and Edwardian styles, was a major hub for transportation and travel in the Eastern US. In 1974, this splendid facility is listed on the National Register of Historic Places. The Grand Concourse restaurant is a true testament of grandeur and elegant dining. With a cathedral stained-glass vaulted ceiling, marble columns, and a dramatic staircase, guests are quickly transported to the glamorous side of the Progressive Era with the luxury of a modern-day menu.
